What is a Discipleship Group?

A Discipleship Group (DG) is a small group of believers (2-4, same gender) who meet regularly to encourage and help one another follow Jesus.

How Often Should I Meet?


A DG should meet weekly or (or biweekly) depending on schedules. The duration of a DG is flexible. Groups can choose to meet during the summer or for set times throughout the year.

Why Should I Seek Out Others to Meet With?

Fully trusting and following after Jesus does not happen automatically in our lives. When a group of believers are focused on God's word and devoted to building one another up to trust and obey Jesus, then growth as a follower of Jesus will take place.

What Does a DG Do?

Not a Program but a Culture

The Lord has called His church to be characterized by a culture of discipleship, not a "program" of discipleship. Discipleship should be a daily habit for the brothers and sisters of RGBC. Members should be engaging in each other's lives and pursuing Christ together. Discipleship Groups are a helpful means to bring this reality about in the life of our church.



Some of you may already be involved in discipleship with others. But, if you are not, pursuing a DG can be a way to become better involved in the lives of those you have covenanted to love. If discipleship is not actively pursued, it may not happen. Let us be faithful to help each other walk in obedience to our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.
